Size: 5 Feet
Weight: 77 lbs
Life span: 25-35 y
Food: fish, mollusks, squid, and crustaceans

Fact: They bury themselves in the sand for camouflage so they can sneak up on their prey.

Black Tip Reef



Size: 5.2 feet
Weight: 30 lbs
Life span: 13 y
Food: small fish

Fact: They are social sharks and prefer to stay in large groups

Blue Shark



Size: 6 ft - 9ft
Weight: 60-121 lbs
Life span: 20 y
Food: Cuttlefish, octopus, lobster, shrimp, crab.

Fact: The Blue Shark can give birth to over 100 pups at a time.

Great White Shark



Size: 11-16 feet
Weight: 2000 lbs
Life span: 70 y
Food: fish, seabirds, cetaceans, pinnipeds, sea turtles, sea otters
Fact: Great White Sharks have been on Earth for 16 million years

Hammerhead Shark



Size: 3-20 feet
Weight: 1,000 lbs
Life span: 20-30 y
Food: Stingray, fish, crab, lobster, squid
Fact: They can see almost completely around their body except right in front of their nose

Tiger Shark



Size: 10-14 feet
Weight: up to 1,400 lbs
Life span: 30-40 y
Food: Sea snakes, birds, seals
Fact: Tiger sharks will eat almost anything, including oil cans, tires, and basketballs

Bull Shark



Size: 5-7 feet

Weight: 200-500 lbs

Life span: 12 y

Food: Fish, turtles, crustaceans, dolphins, birds

Fact: Bull sharks can live in fresh water and salt water. They've been found in the Amazon and Mississippi Rivers.

Lemon Shark



Size: 7.8-11 feet

Weight: 190-220 lbs

Life span: 25+ y

Food: Small fish

Fact: They live in shallow waters and are not aggressive. humans often interact with lemon sharks.

Leopard Shark



Size: 4-5 feet

Weight: 40 lbs

Life span: 30 y

Food: crab, shrimp

Clams, octopus, bony fish

Fact: Leopard sharks usually live in the same area for their entire life.

Nurse Shark



Size: 7.5-14 feet

Weight: 200-300 lbs

Life span: 25 y

Food: small fish

Fact: The nurse shark can breathe in the water without moving by pumping water from its mouth to its gills.
