




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Going Behind the Scenes with LARCS

An Interview with LARCS President, Armando Rutledge

With the state government and health agencies reopening California for 'business as usual,' Ladera's community services division, LARCS has received the green light to host events again. We caught up with LARCS President, Armando Rutledge to ask him about challenges of the event business and what residents can expect going forward.



Rutledge: It was a year of learning that came wrapped in challenges, setbacks and the unexpected. We endured the impact of cancelling our traditional events and pivoted to innovate and create new programming and events that kept our residents safe and complied with state and health agency mandates. Today we're poised for a great year which started with our summer concert series, will continue with the Celebrate Ladera event, which will be held on September 5, and our winter events later in the year.

R&W: What is Celebrate Ladera?

Rutledge: It's an event that is meant to bring the community together following a tough year. We had plans last year to celebrate our 20th year anniversary which had to be cancelled. It was disappointing to have to cancel our July 4th event earlier this year. It's time to celebrate and to promote unity in our community. Celebrate Ladera is for all residents to enjoy – we will have live musical entertainment, food trucks and the biggest fireworks show Ladera has ever seen.



R&W: What can residents look forward to when it comes to events?

Rutledge: There is a great deal to look forward to. The LARCS Event Planning Committee, staff, vendors and Board of Directors are working closely to plan and implement a full calendar of events. Although our vendors need time to ramp up to offer their full line of capabilities, we're confident that our fall and winter events will be better than ever.

R&W: How can residents participate and share feedback?

Rutledge: First, we are actively recruiting for open volunteer positions on our Event Planning and Ranch Hands Committees and for a non-voting position on the LARCS Board. 



he LARMAC Board of Directors has approved the next phase of playground renovation projects which include the replacement of play structures at eight parks.

The playground replacement project has been in the works over the past two years and continues with the replacement of play structures and rubber play surfaces at Arroyo Grande, Boreal, Canterra, Cherry, Celestial, Flintridge, Founders and Oso Grande parks starting in September.

Each of these parks has reached the end of their 'useful life,' a term that is used in LARMAC's Reserve Study, which assigns an estimated life for every asset, and a funding plan for future repair and/or replacement projects. A portion of the HOA monthly assessments fund the reserves projects, which helps to keep LARMAC's amenities in good condition. The equipment at each of these original parks was showing signs of wear, and maintenance costs were starting to increase.

Although the physical portion of the project has yet to commence, a great deal of research and planning work has been done by LARMAC staff, the Facilities Committee and residents. Feedback received included the desire to incorporate inclusive elements of play for children with varying abilities.

Founders and Celestial parks will feature inclusive playground equipment and ramps that are integrated into the play structures. Each of the new play structures are designed for children ages 5 to 12; Oso Grande Park will also have play equipment for children ages 2 to 5 years old.

LARMAC received over 105 playground designs by seven vendors that provided proposals. In order to maximize value, all eight locations were bundled together in one project.

According to Chase Fitzpatrick, LARMAC President, "By grouping the eight locations into one project, LARMAC can

take advantage of the economies of scale and reduced costs due to the mobilization of material and equipment. The installation and maintenance of the playgrounds will be easier to manage having one vendor for the installation and the ordering of replacement parts."

By approving all locations at once, LARMAC saved approximately 40%.

Great Western Recreation and GameTime (equipment manufacturer) were selected to partner with LARMAC on the

project. GameTime has been a leader in the play industry since 1929 and has significantly invested in the research and enrichment of childhood play. KJ LeCesne, Playologist at Great Western Recreation said, "We've applied this research to these new play spaces and have carefully designed these parks to promote exploration, imagination, multigenerational play, inclusion and youth physical fitness. We're excited for your families to experience your new playgrounds."

In an effort to recycle, reuse and support a good cause, LARMAC has partnered with Kids Around

The World (KATW) to refurbish seven of the eight existing playgrounds. The donated equipment will be removed by KATW at their expense which will save the community \$70,000 on the demolition and disposal of the existing play structures.

KATW refurbishes and installs playground equipment in underserved communities. KATW has partnered with a job training program in Mexico which consists of welding and other trades. After a few months of the playgrounds being installed, KATW will share photos and the impact the playgrounds are having in the communities they are placed. Terramor Aquatic Park

Ladera's water park is 16 years old and includes all original structural equipment and components. Annual maintenance has helped to extend the life of the structure; however, it is showing signs of its age and is need of an update. Many of the water features will be updated in the offseason along with additional maintenance with hopes of extending the life of the structure a few more years before a full replacement will be needed.



Covenant Hills Clubhouse

Design plans to improve and enhance the outdoor patio and grass area at the Covenant Hills Village Clubhouse are currently being reviewed and considered. The Covenant Hills Clubhouse is one of the most popular among residents who rent the space for weddings, bridal showers and receptions. The initial improvement plans have been designed with these types of events in mind.



Oak Knoll Clubhouse

Ladera's original clubhouse continues to receive updates as part of a phased approach to updating and refreshing the clubhouse. To-date, the exterior and interior have been repainted and the flooring in the great room has been replaced. The next phase will focus on remodeling of the great room and entry area.

Landscape Management: Organic Landscape Management Practices

In a continued effort to apply Integrated Pest Management (IPM) practices within LARMAC's landscape, the LARMAC Board is pleased to share this update of an organic landscape consulting contract with Osborne Organics. The scope of work is focused on gathering information and developing a transitional plan to organic pest management at the following locations:

- Founders Park
- Oso Grande Park
- Chaparral Park
- Cambridge/Covenant Hills Drive Greenbelt Area
- Wagsdale Park

All portions of the parks (turf and planter beds) have been included in this transitional program, which is estimated to occur over the next 2-3 years. The initial process will involve site analysis, review of current and historical maintenance practices and soil tests.





The work that began earlier this year is part of a transitional process. Soil tests have been completed and once the results have been analyzed, the preliminary program will begin. When moving from a chemical materials program to an organic one, it should not be expected that everything is completed by the end of Year One.

New practices will be introduced over the transitional three-year process. This will include improving soil health, introducing new product, and ultimately looking to have a healthy, biologically active soil that will improve plant health and vigor and maintain expectations. Throughout the transition, Osborne Organics will set goals to create a soil and plant environment that will require less input in the years that follow.

The determination of a management level depends upon the communicated individual site expectations. Site expectations govern the level of cultural intensity. Cultural intensity is everything that goes into managing the Ladera Ranch site. This includes labor, product input, and water.

Product applications will be natural, organic and preferably materials that are approved by the Organic Materials Review Institute (OMRI). If a product is not able to be sourced to meet the above criteria, an organic compatible product that is not OMRI certified will be allowed. This includes fertilizers, soil amendments, microbial inoculates, and those amendments that are considered to be microbial food sources.

An annual election is hosted each year to fill open seats as they come up on the rotation schedule that is outlined in the community bylaws. The Board of Directors are elected by the membership (homeowners) through the Neighborhood Representative system.

- Neighborhood Representatives certify the membership votes for their neighborhood
- Apartment owners serve as the Neighborhood Rep for their communities and can cast one vote for every three apartments (e.g. An apartment complex with 300 unites can cast 100 votes)
