Controlling Costs

Recently, LARMAC renegotiated the bulk internet service contract with Cox. Unique to Ladera, residents receive high-speed internet service through the bulk agreement that LARMAC has with Cox. Residents pay approximately one-third of the cost of internet service than if they purchased it directly from Cox.

Spring Events

The season brings community events like Spring Celebration and new favorites, Paws in the Park and the Create and Connect Workshops. The Community Garage Sale and Go Green Ladera return this year with some updates. We've included a special insert as a guide for this fun, one-day event. See page 10.

Playground Renovation

LARMAC has completed the renovation of all 26 playgrounds throughout the community. Many playgrounds received new play equipment, rubber play surfaces, and shade structures. The playgrounds are colorful and encourage creative and imaginative play. MODELING LEADERSHIP

FOR *Young People*

An election year presents an opportunity to connect with the young people in our lives. We can model empowering habits and skills to serve our children and young people we influence positively.

In a new era of business and society, skills such as being flexible, adaptable, being able to work cooperatively with those who are different from us in thinking, experiences, and perspectives, serve us well. Having a growth mindset allows one to learn and grow. By contrast, simply complaining and focusing on an impasse and what can't be done leave us dead in the water.

Young people desperately need positive role models who exemplify accountability, responsibility, generosity, mindfulness, kindness, and community participation. Consider ways you can model positive leadership and positively impact our community.

Consider these five actions you can take to model leadership and mentor young people to help them develop valuable skills and experience.

Start with Gratitude

A great starting point is to focus on what we appreciate about our community. Put pen to paper and make a list. In this face-to-face interaction, discuss why each item made the list. It allows us to learn something new about each other, and to identify shared values. It opens the door to connect with our teens in a meaningful way.

Stay Informed

Each Thursday, *Ladera Happenings* includes easy-to-scan briefs with the latest news and announcements about projects, events, recreation programs, and more. Read *Roots and Wings* magazine together. Take time to read these updates with your teens and help make the connection between staying informed and actively participating in the community.

Ideate

Divergent thinking is a thought process used to generate creative ideas by exploring many possible solutions. Make a list of things your family members would like to improve, and create a list of as many solutions as possible, no matter how far-fetched the idea. By fostering divergent thinking, our teens become better creative problem-solvers. It instills the value and importance of being solution-oriented and a problem-solver.

Volunteer

Taking the time to volunteer helps solve the issue of entitlement in young people. Why? Because volunteering is about serving others. When we serve others, we see things through a new lens, which gives us a new perspective. Being able to understand others' perspectives is a valuable discipline that can have a positive impact on our personal relationships, careers, problem-solving, and business. Ladera Ranch Community Services, Lions Heart, The Nature Reserve at Rancho Mission Viejo, offer young people opportunities to volunteer locally.

Participate

One of the benefits of teens participating in their community is that they will meet good folks. These are often genuine people making positive contributions that benefit the lives of our neighbors. Good things happen when young people actively step up, lean in, and participate in their community. Ladera Ranch residents can start new clubs, attend homeowner meetings, volunteer at community events, and get involved in clubs at school.

Do's

- ✓ Review the LARMAC Aesthetics Standards prior to submitting your plan.
- ✓ Review the exterior paint color schemes for your home style on Laderalife.com. Include two hard copy sets of paint chips in addition to submitting them electronically.
- ✓ Stick with the color paint color scheme for your home and strictly adhere to your approved plan.
- ✓ Submit your legible plan electronically in PDF format, and always submit color photos.
- ✓ Complete Neighbor Notification Form and submit with your plan.
- ✓ Be mindful of adjacent LARMAC property and/or easement areas if you live in a Front Yard Special Benefit Area (SBA) neighborhood.

Dont's

- ✗ Begin your project without first obtaining approval from the Aesthetics Review Committee (ARC).
- ✗ Submit a paint scheme that is inconsistent with your home style.
- ✗ Paint any exposed brick or stone without ARC approval when painting the exterior of your home.
- ✗ Submit photos that are too close-up.
- ✗ Submit your plan without a complete Neighbor Notification Form.
- ✗ Place a dumpster or portable restroom on LARMAC common areas, streets, or sidewalks.

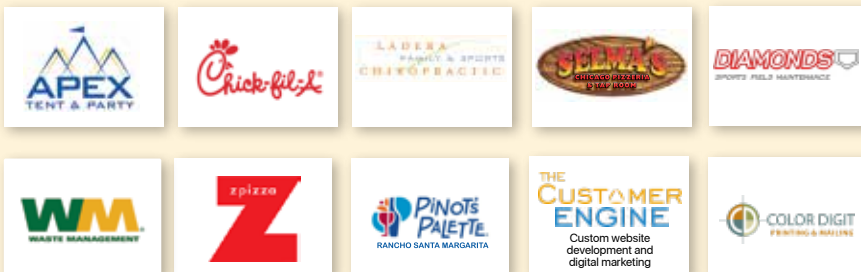

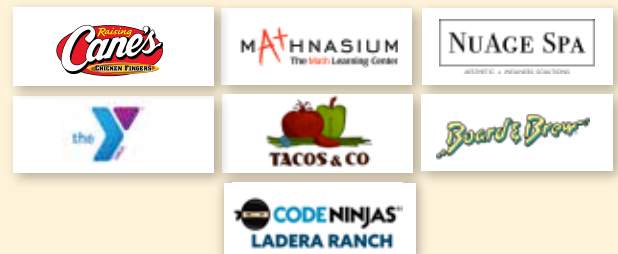

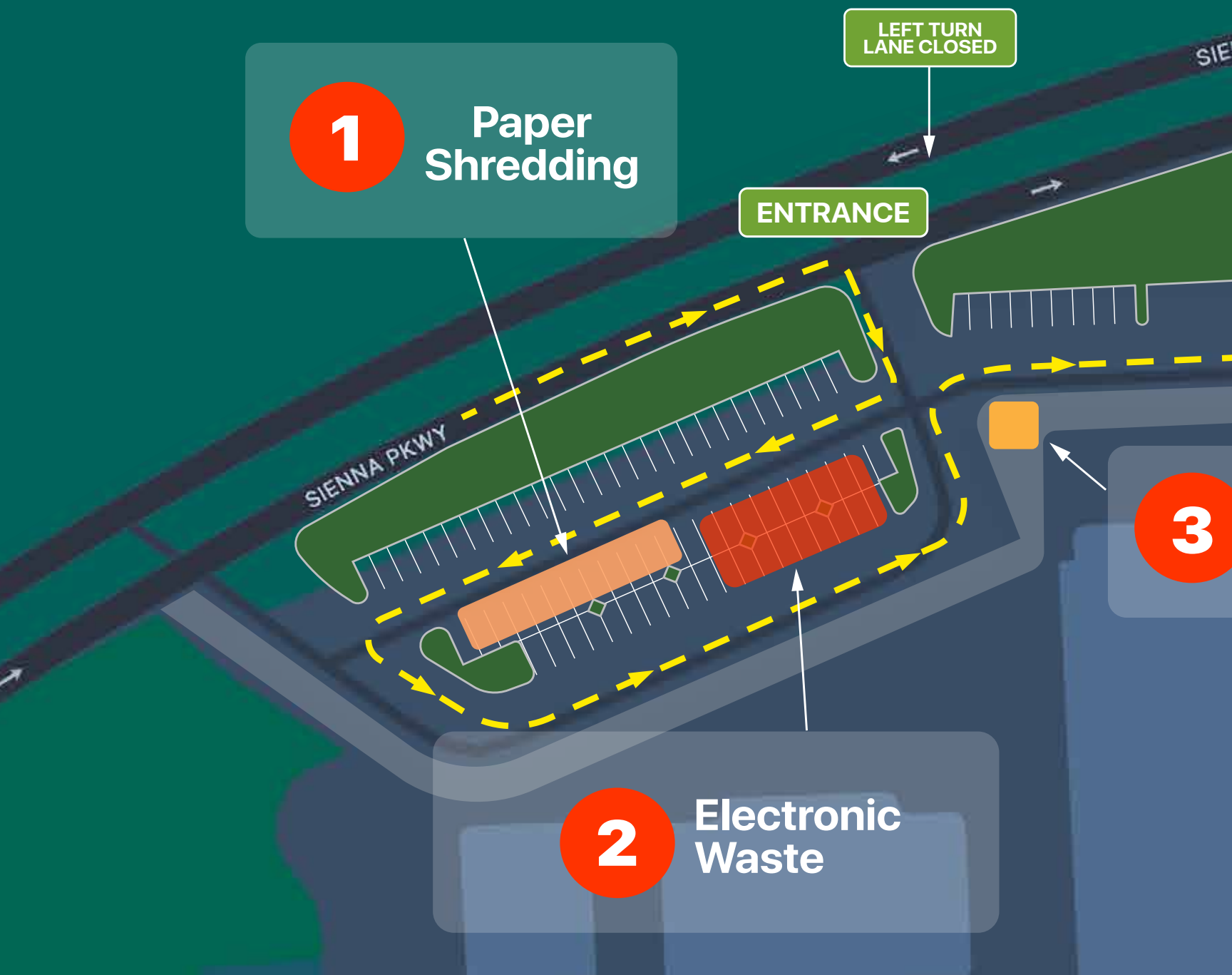
